# National English Reading Competition for College Students (Total: 100 marks Time: 60 minutes)

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#### 赛题分值说明:

1、初赛: 题型为客观题与主观题,共5篇阅读文章,其中2篇长篇3篇短篇。每篇长篇下设置5道客观单选小题;每篇短篇下设置3道小题(2道客1观单选题,1道主观题)。共19道题,答题时间为60分钟,满分100分。长篇每题5.5分;短篇每题5分。

2、决赛: 题型为客观题与主观题,共8篇阅读文章,其中2篇长篇6篇短篇。每篇长篇下设置5道客观单选小题;每篇短篇下设置3道小题(2道客观单选题,1道主观题)。共28道题,答题时长为60分钟,满分100分。长篇每题4分;短篇客观单选题每题3分,主观题每题4分。

# Read the paragraph. Then answer the questions. (Questions 1-5)

Anxiety and eating issues often go hand in hand and the difficulty with the two issues is that they both need to be addressed as it's hard to tell which issue triggered the other.

The two symptoms, when seen together, often reinforce each other. For example, anxiety has a lot to do with excessive worry and fear. This then results in physical problems such as fatigue, irritability and trouble sleeping. For some kids, their stomachs get upset due to feelings of anxiety. This in turn, leads to a lack of appetite and decreases how much the child eats.

The more someone decreases their food intake, the more it actually affects their mental health, even if it originally had nothing to do with body image issues.

A study called the Minnesota Starvation Study, done in the 1940s, showed how physically and mentally healthy men became people with symptoms similar to those with anorexia nervosa. The researchers cut back these men's calorie intake drastically. And once they lost a certain amount of weight, they all began having psychological

issues such as the hoarding of food, incessantly thinking about food, compulsive exercising, as well as experiencing depression and anxiety.

Your child may have a problem if they aren't eating well and not gaining a healthy amount of weight and growth. Low body weight and insufficient consumption of food will worsen any problems with anxiety. And this can turn into a full-fledged eating disorder if not treated.

The good news for children who have eating issues is that early intervention is generally very successful. But they must be addressed alongside the issues of anxiety or other mental health issues, even if they aren't seen as the main problem. But if treated correctly, younger children are likely to experience positive outcomes and experience a resolution to their problems.

The region of Germany known as Bavaria has many attractions. One of them is Neuschwanstein, a castle built for King Ludwig II in the late 19th century. The castle's rooms are richly decorated. The Singers' Hall, which occupies the fourth floor, contains paintings of characters from medieval tales and 19th-century operas. The Venus grotto on the third floor is one of the castle's most unusual rooms. This artificial cave has a waterfall and colored lighting to give it a romantic atmosphere. Ludwig could go there and listen to music coming from the Singers' Hall. Sadly, Ludwig spent only 11 nights in the castle before he died in 1886.

East of Neuschwanstein is Oberammergau, a town known for its festivals, beautifully painted buildings and wood-carving tradition. A popular attraction is the Hansel and Gretel House. In the past, this huge house contained a wood-carving school and an orphanage. Today, it is home to a government-run social-services center. The outside of the house is decorated with painted scenes from traditional tales about two children named Hansel and Gretel. Not far away is the Little Red Riding House, which features scenes from another tale titled Little Red Riding Hood.

South of Oberammergau is Zugspitze, the highest mountain in Germany. A railroad and cable car take tourists to the summit, where there are restaurants with delicious food and wonderful views of nearby peaks. In the winter, Zugspitze attracts skiers who bring their own equipment or rent skis at the summit. During the other seasons, hiking between Zugspitze to other mountains is popular but also challenging. Only those who are physically fit should attempt these hikes.

East of Zugspitze is the town of Mittenwald. Centuries ago, Mittenwald was a wealthy trading center. Now its economy depends on tourism and its violin-making industry. Violins were first produced in Mittenwald in 1684. Nearby forests provided excellent wood for the instruments. Violins are still made there today, and visitors can learn about violin-making at the Geigenbaumuseum. The displays in this museum trace the history and development of this traditional craft.

# Read the paragraph. Then answer the questions. (Questions 14-16)

The Central American country of Belize has done much to protect its natural beauty, beginning with the Belize Barrier Reef System. This 300-kilometer-long stretch of reefs was officially declared a World Heritage site in 1996. In 2009, it was added to UNESCO's list of endangered World Heritage sites because commercial activities were threatening Belize's ecosystems in the ocean and on land.

Belize responded in 2010 by banning bottom trawling within the reef system. This method of fishing uses a commercial-fishing boat and a long, cone-shaped net that is very wide at the front and narrow at the enclosed end. One or more cables run from the boat to the mouth of the net, which is weighed down by two heavy weights.

The weights hold the front of the net firmly on the ocean floor. As the boat moves through the water, it pulls the net along the ocean floor. The net scoops up fish but also harms everything else living on the floor of the ocean. Thus, banning this fishing method was necessary to save the Belize Barrier Reef System.

In 2015, the country also banned oil drilling within one kilometer of the reef system. In 2017 they stopped all oil exploration in Belizean waters.

UNESCO responded by removing the Belize Barrier Reef System from the list of endangered World Heritage sites in 2018. The news was celebrated by environmental organizations all around the world.

Recently, the government of Belize has also begun taking steps to protect one of Central America's largest forests. Called the Maya Forest, it covers more than 13 million square acres of land in three countries, namely, Mexico, Guatemala and Belize. Much of this forest within Belize has been cut down and turned into farmland during the past decade. To prevent this from continuing, Belize is working with international partners to purchase privately-owned land within the forest. The goal is to secure almost 25,000 acres of forest land, which the government will permanently protect.

Web browsers are essential tools for anyone who wants to use the Internet, and competition among browsers has always been fierce. There have been losers and winners in this war. Just over a decade ago, Internet Explorer was the most popular browser, followed by Firefox, Chrome and Safari in that order. But between 2009 and 2019, the percentage of people using Internet Explorer decreased around 60 percent. Chrome, on the other hand, enjoyed an increase in usage of about 45 percent. Firefox experienced much smaller growth, while Safari usage stayed about the same.

Why do people choose one web browser over another? For some people, an important factor is how available a browser's extensions can be. Extensions are programs that add new abilities to a browser after they are installed. They can do everything from blocking online advertisements to changing the actual appearance of websites.

Users should, however, be careful about which extensions they install because some of these programs can present security risks. Extensions with highest risks are often those that require access to users' accounts in order to operate. The Zoom extension for Chrome, for example, can schedule Zoom meetings from Google Calendar, but to do that, it needs access to the user's Google Calendar and the information that it contains. The same is true of the Evernote extension, which requires access to the user's Evernote account. Giving extensions access to one's accounts can sometimes be dangerous.

To use browser extensions safely, experts recommend taking the following steps:

• Before installing an extension, visit the website of the company that developed the extension. Check to make sure that both the company and extension are honest and worthy of your trust. In addition, read reviews of the extension to find out whether other people have detected problems with it.

- After installing an extension, examine it using your security software to make sure that the program doesn't contain any viruses.
- Finally, don't install more extensions than you absolutely need. If you do, you will expose yourself to greater risk.
